



## Apprentice Incentives

Program	For the Apprentice	Amount
<b>Prepare for Apprenticeship: Pre- Apprenticeship training</b>	Apply for free training inclusive of free textbooks, safety equipment and tools for 52 weeks. Available for youth or adults who have graduated high school or left before finishing high school, unemployed or underemployed, or are indigenous, new comers to Canada, women, Francophone or youth-at-risk. <a href="https://bit.ly/2NDtzcF">https://bit.ly/2NDtzcF</a>	Apply for free training.
<b>Apprenticeship Incentive Grant for Women</b>	Taxable grant to support women in entering, progressing, and completing training in a Red Seal trade. <a href="https://bit.ly/2pqAy7R">https://bit.ly/2pqAy7R</a>	\$3,000 per year/level (or equivalent) Maximum amount per person is \$6,000.
<b>Support to Non-EI Eligible Apprentices</b>	This initiative provides up to \$1,500 of taxable financial supports for apprentices who attend full-time in-school apprenticeship training and are not eligible for Employment Insurance (EI). <a href="https://bit.ly/2dIHVpL">https://bit.ly/2dIHVpL</a>	Up to \$1,500.
<b>Loans for Tools Program</b>	Offers new apprentices a loan to help them buy the tools and equipment they need to perform the trade in which they are registered. The loan is interest-free for the duration of the apprentice's training and for up to one year following the completion of training. <a href="https://bit.ly/2dIHVpL">https://bit.ly/2dIHVpL</a>	The maximum loan an apprentice may receive varies according to sector: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• service \$300</li> <li>• construction \$400</li> <li>• industrial \$400</li> <li>• motive power \$800</li> </ul>
<b>Tradesperson's Tools Deduction</b>	Provides employed apprentices with a tax deduction to help cover the cost of new tools necessary for their trade. <a href="https://bit.ly/2Fy92zV">https://bit.ly/2Fy92zV</a>	Up to \$500 tax deduction on new tools.
<b>Employment Insurance for Apprentices</b>	If you are referred by your province or territory to attend full-time training or block release training, you could be eligible to receive Employment Insurance while unemployed and attending your course. <a href="https://bit.ly/2X4BdkP">https://bit.ly/2X4BdkP</a>	Employment Insurance (EI) benefits.
<b>Employment Ontario Services</b>	Employment Ontario can help you get training, build skills or find a job. They connect people looking for work with employers looking for workers. <a href="https://bit.ly/2cflqls">https://bit.ly/2cflqls</a>	Free for those unemployed.



## Apprentice Incentives

Program	For the Apprentice	Amount
<b>Apprenticeship Incentive Grant</b>	A taxable cash grant available to registered apprentices once they have successfully finished their first level of classroom training and have been a registered apprentice for a minimum of 12 months. A second Apprenticeship Incentive Grant is available when you have completed your second level of classroom training and have been a registered apprentice for a minimum of 24 months. <a href="https://bit.ly/2S0r6aU">https://bit.ly/2S0r6aU</a>	The Apprenticeship Incentive Grant (AIG) is a taxable cash grant of \$1,000 per year or level. Maximum amount of \$2,000 per person for those out of high school and training in a Red Seal trade.
<b>Apprenticeship Completion Grant</b>	A one-time taxable cash grant available to apprentices out of high school and training in a Red Seal trade. <a href="https://bit.ly/2S0r6aU">https://bit.ly/2S0r6aU</a>	Up to \$2,000.
<b>Apprenticeship Completion Bonus in Non-Red Seal Trades</b>	Taxable cash grant available to apprentices out of high school and completed training and received a Certificate of Apprenticeship in a non-Red Seal trade. <a href="https://bit.ly/2S0r6aU">https://bit.ly/2S0r6aU</a>	Up to \$2,000.
<b>Student loans, grants, scholarships and bursaries</b>	Where to find money that can help you pay for an apprenticeship program after high school. For more information please go to: <a href="https://bit.ly/2p66m5D">https://bit.ly/2p66m5D</a>	Dependant on chosen loan, grant, scholarship or bursary.
<b>OYAP: Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program</b>	Ontario OYAP student can be signed as an apprentice while still in high school. Students at the age of 16 or 17 must fill out an application form to the Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities. <a href="https://bit.ly/2JAdA9Z">https://bit.ly/2JAdA9Z</a>	Training for students in grade 11 or 12.
<b>Canada Apprentice Loan</b>	The Canada Apprentice Loan is an initiative of the Government of Canada to help you complete your apprenticeship in a designated Red Seal trade. <a href="https://bit.ly/2nmMd9h">https://bit.ly/2nmMd9h</a>	With the Canada Apprentice Loan, you can get up to \$4,000 in interest-free loans per period of technical training.
